Sanitary Sewer Overflow (SSO) can contain raw sewage, such as bacteria, that can be harmful to our health. For that reason, it is important to follow these steps if you see an SSO:

- Stay away from the overflow area (typically a manhole). This is especially important for children and pets who may play near the overflow area, which can be a street, public park, or local streams, creeks, and river.
- Stay away from and do not touch the overflow. If you come in contact with the sewage overflow, immediately wash your hands thoroughly in warm, soapy water before handling food or touching other people or surfaces.
- Report the location of the overflow immediately to the Department of Public Works at the following numbers:
